Quebec, May 28, 2014 – A year prior to the grand opening of *Le Monastère des Augustines* – a vast heritage complex dedicated to total health – the *Fiducie du patrimoine culturel des Augustines* is proud to present the new Board of Directors of the non-profit organization (NPO) responsible for developing the concept and operating the site once the construction and renovation work is completed.

The Board of the NPO for *Le Monastère des Augustines* will be able to count on the leadership of its 5 new members to ensure that it achieves its objectives: the development, operationalization and marketing of the various products and services that Le Monastère will offer, including a museum; an archival centre; experiential accommodations; programming in total health, culture, and specialized care; as well as a restaurant and a boutique.

In close collaboration with the NPO, the Fiducie continues to oversee major restoration work to the historical buildings in Old Quebec where the activities of *Le Monastère des Augustines* will take place beginning in the summer of 2015.

Le Monastère des Augustines grew out of the Augustinian Sisters' will to entrust their invaluable heritage that has accumulated since 1639 to the people of Quebec. More than 40 000 artefacts and 1 linear km of archives and old books will be gathered together at the Hôtel-Dieu de Québec monastery and will be accessible to the public in 2015. Cutting-edge, contemporary programming that promotes both culture and the concept of total health will respond to the needs of today's people for renewal on many levels. Designed in an integrative fashion, l'Hôtellerie, le Musée and les Archives will all reinforce the unique experience of the new facility.

The Centre Catherine-de-Saint-Augustin, for which the sisters continue to have responsibility, will be relocated in the church.
